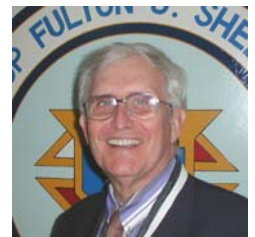

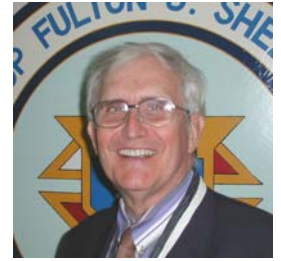

Hope your Easter was a joyous & happy one! Someone recently said to me as we were deciding to embark on a new idea "What would Jesus do?" I thought, what a beautiful and thoughtful question to help us on our daily journey.

St. Vincent's Center:

Can you help? I would like to share with you A Little bit about St. Vincent's Center and what they do:

The Center is a large group home in Timonium housing approximately 70 children or more, ages range from 3 to 12 years sponsored by Catholic Charities. These children have suffered terrible abuses most of their young lives- physically and emotionally. Most have suffered severe neglect and poverty. My daughter, Katie, volunteered at St. Vincent's for 1 1/2 years, and therefore I am personally familiar with the wonderful works of love performed there each day. When asked what we could do as a group, they replied spring and summer clothing for the children were needed. .

\$1 Billion Increase in New Life Insurance in 2004
