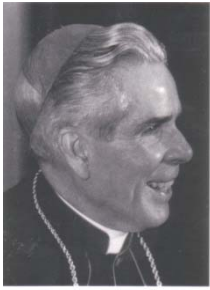

It has been 38 years since this decision, and by some accounts approximately 54 million abortions have been performed in the United States since then. But the Speakers of the day inspired me to think and prayer that it will end soon. It is always nice to see all kinds of people come out and show their support for the Unborn. And by the grace of God I found Mike Hurley in the crowd, and was able to say hello to the group from St. Josephs.

The Bad News

Dr. Kermit Gosnell, 69, and nine employees from his West Philadelphia practice was charged with 8 counts of murder, one

mom and seven babies. The story is horrific and is what the abortion industry has become.

A recent study of abortion has found that 35 percent of all U.S. women will have had an abortion by age 45, and that 93 percent of all abortions occur for "social reasons" such as a mother's decision that the child is unwanted or "inconvenient." Another staggering statistic is that Catholic women account for more than 31 percent of all abortions performed in the United States. These numbers are disappointing to say the least.

The Good News

We now have two pro-life representatives from Maryland. As Roscoe Bartlett announced at the March for Life, this is his 18th year serving and the only time there has been two pro-life congressmen from Maryland: himself and Rep. Andy Harris.

The new republican Congress has been sworn in and has made Life a top priority. After passing a bill to Repeal the Obama Health Care law. They have introduced "No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act", HR 3. This bill is designed to permanently end any U.S. government financial support for abortion, whether it be direct funding or by tax credits or any other subsidy. This Bill was introduced by Rep. Chris Smith (R-NJ), the longtime chairman of the House Pro-Life Caucus. Smith's bill would do more than just write into law existing abortion restrictions. It would also eliminate tax benefits for insurance policies that cover abortion — even abortions in most cases of medical necessity.

Another representative, Rep Joe Pitts (R-PA), another longtime abortion opponent, plans to introduce a bill, the "Protect Life Act," that he says would close loopholes in the health law that allows abortion funding.

As the new speaker of the House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) said, "A ban on taxpayer funding of abortion is the will of the people, and it ought to be the will of the land."

Let's pray that they succeed and will continue to fight for the unborn

Please continue to pray for the unborn.
