Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen Society

Holy men and women are often endowed by our Lord with the gift of prophecy, and there is strong evidence that Archbishop Sheen was blessed with this gift. In 1951 at the emergence of the Cold War, Archbishop Sheen spoke at an international peace conference in Lisbon, Portugal. He spoke of Our Lady of Fatima and in particular, her second prophecy of Fatima, the peaceful fall of Soviet Communism, which has now been fulfilled. At the conference, Archbishop Sheen made this bold proclamation:

"Our Lady has been chosen to be known by the name of FATIMA, which was the name of the daughter of Mohammed, because *She has come not only for the conversion of Russia but also for the millions of Mohammedans...without whom there could never be true world peace.*"

Archbishop Sheen foresaw the threat of radical Islam as being as dangerous to world peace equal to the Soviet nuclear threat. He stated that Our Lady of Fatima represents, "a sign of hope to the Muslim people." True Muslims have a very strong reverence for Mary; in fact her name is stated more

often in the Koran than it is in the New Testament. When praying our Rosaries to Our Lady of Fatima, please ask her to not only look after our American men in women defending against the insidious evil of radical Islam, but for the righteous Muslims, particularly the women and mothers. Pray that the Mother of God will reveal herself mothers of Islamic world to give them the courage to stand up to those who commit acts of atrocity invoking God's name.
